Public Transportation to the GL10 Conference Center 3

For those conference participants using public transportation to and from the GL10 Conference Center, please note that from Amsterdam Central Station you can either take the train or subway to Amstel Train Station, or you can take the train to Muiderpoort Train Station. Transfer from either of these train stations to Bus No. 40, which takes you to Science Park Amsterdam. This circle bus line leaves about every 15 minutes from both Amstel Station and Muiderpoort Station.
