ANSWERS:

- 1. By camera-ready copy is meant either a PDF file or a printed copy of the full text in compliance with guidelines for submission of the conference papers.
- 2. A presentation in a session is allotted more time than a presentation in a panel. In a session, however, the Q&A immediately follows a presentation. In a panel, all of the presentations are first given and afterwards the chairperson opens the Discussion. At GL6, the format of Day One is in session, and Day Two in panel.
- 3. Since the GL6 Conference Program was first announced, a couple of changes have been made. These, however, do not affect the Conference Timetable. Changes in either the conference program or schedule are immediately provided on the conference site at http://www.textrelease.com/pages/3
- 4. The conference room in which both the sessions and panels take place seats a maximum of 100-classroom style. For a two-day international conference, space and comfort are priorities. Based on early registrations, a full house is anticipated for GL6.
- 5. The closing date for conference registrations is determined by the contract with the catering and the printer. Friday, November 26th 2004 is the deadline for Conference Registration and the receipt of payments. http://www.textrelease.com/pages/4
