Among its services, the agency offers consultancy on access to grey literature from Eastern Europe as well as search services. The Social Science Information Center manages the SOLIS databank, which contains more than 300.000 citations - including some 50.000 abstracts to grey literature in the social sciences from German speaking countries i.e. Germany, Austria, and Switzerland.
